Make an Indian tiger mask out of a paper plate






You will need:


1 x A4 Piece of Card Brown paper or card Yellow, Orange and Red Tissue Paper Red and Black Felt Tip Pen Pencil Glue Stick



- 1. Cut out templates
- 2. Fold A4 piece of card into two
- 3. Draw round clay pot on brown paper and cut out
- 4. Stick brown pot to card
- 5. Draw ovals at the top of the pot as shown in the picture above
- 6. Draw round flame on card with a pencil
- 7. Tear off small pieces of tissue paper and scrunch these up into balls starting with yellow and fill in flame outline.
- 8. Continue tearing off orange and then red tissue paper for centre of flame
- 9. Draw lines on with red felt tip pen to show glow of flame
- 10. Write Happy Diwali at the bottom









Diwali—Lantern



You will need:

Plasticine or modelling clay Tea Light

- 1. Roll a ball of plasticine approx 5cm in diameter
- 2. Push thumb into middle
- 3. Squeeze edges between forefinger and thumb to shape into a pot
- 4. Roll sides smooth
- 5. Put tea light inside pot to check it fits
- 6. Decorate with other colours of plasticine




Diwali—Indian Elephant



You will need:

1 x A4 Piece of White Card Felt Tip Pens Glue Stick Scissors


- 1. Cut out template
- 2. Fold A4 piece of white card into two (landscape)
- 3. Stick template on to white card
- 4. Colour in using felt tip pens
- 5. Cut out round elephant being careful to leave top edge (as shown below)



Leave edge where arrows are marked









Diwali—Rangoli Pattern



You will need:

Felt tip pens Scissors

- 1. Colour in template on next page using felt tip pens
- 2. Cut out pattern
